### **Policy Background**

"The Programme should support R&I activities in the field of social sciences and humanities (SSH). This entails advancing scientific knowledge in that domain and making use of insights and progress from SSH to increase economic and societal impact of the Programme."

Horizon Europe Regulation, Para. 14, L 170/3

"Horizon Europe shall ensure a multidisciplinary approach and shall foresee, where appropriate, the integration of social sciences and humanities across all clusters and activities developed under the Programme, including specific calls on SSH related topics."

Horizon Europe Regulation, Art. 7 "Principles of the Problem", para. 2

"The effective integration of social sciences and humanities (SSH) in all clusters, including all missions and partnerships, is a principle through the Programme cycle. SSH are a key constituent of research and innovation, especially regarding the twin green and digital transitions."

#### Why is there a need for SSH Integration?


- Need for "human centric" focus in all research areas of the Horizon Europe Programme
- Develop better solutions to complex problems facing Europe/the world
  - Technical solutions are not enough!
- Develop solutions with clear social relevance, cost effectiveness, and marketability
- Integration of SSH disciplines in R&I projects leads to stronger societal impact, broader/better citizen engagement

#### What is SSH Integration?


- ▶ A technical term of the European Commission referring to the doing of inter-/multi-/transdisciplinary research
- Refers to heterogeneous groups of actors (i.e. researchers) stemming from different disciplines within the social sciences and humanities ("SSH")
- Differing thematic specialties and methodological approaches
- **▶** Research collaborations between STEM and SSH disciplines

## Research modalities referenced under SSH Integration

Interdisciplinarity




Combines two or more disciplines working on same problem, lots of interaction; goes beyond disciplinary boundaries; creates new knowledge; innovative because of flexible philosophy of how knowledge created Multidisciplinarity



Multiple disciplines at once all working on same problem, but from individual disciplinary approaches, perspectives, ideas; limited to no interaction between the disciplines involved

**Transdisciplinarity** 



Combines many disciplines & actors from other sectors (i.e. business, civil society) working on same problem; lots of interaction; aim is to go beyond create new frameworks that are beyond disciplinary boundaries

- SSH Integration as cross-cutting issue & research principle
- Clearly mentioned in topic text as part of "expected societal impacts"

#### Why include SSH in a proposal?

- European Commission explicitly calls on SSH experts to contribute to framing the questions and issues to be tackled in Horizon Europe
- Topics are 'flagged' for SSH by European Commission, i.e. they point to SSH research as integral part of the expertise needed to properly address the issue outlined in the topic
- Proposals submitted for topics 'flagged' for SSH should contain meaningful, integrated contributions from SSH researchers

#### Why include SSH in a proposal?

- Depending on the topic: **indispensable** for understanding the challenge to be addressed
- SSH perspectives can lead to new findings, approaches, and solutions
- Improved application/use of project results: complex social problems require socially acceptable solutions and products
- **Better chances** during evaluation (for SSH-relevant topics)

## **Evaluation of SSH Integration in Horizon Europe**

**Three** evaluation criteria regarding SSH aspects observed by evaluators:

Excellence

For topics indicating the need for the integration of social sciences and humanities, is the role of these disciplines properly addressed?

**Impact** 

Are the proposed dissemination, exploitation and communication measures suitable?

**Implementation** 

Does the consortium match the project's objectives, and bring together the necessary disciplinary and interdisciplinary knowledge?

For topics flagged as SSH relevant, does the consortium include expertise in social sciences and humanities?

#### Flagging SSH research in Horizon Europe

Flagging: "to mark (an item) for attention or treatment in a specified way"

- Main instrument used by the European Commission to ensure involvement of specific SSH research methods, competencies, and skills in funded research projects
- ▶ Flagging in <u>all</u> clusters (Cluster 1,3, 4, 5, 6) <u>except</u> for Cluster 2 ("SSH-dedicated" cluster) and missions
- Specific terminology (i.e. words and phrases) is used to identify SSH research / researcher / expert involvement

#### Flagging SSH research in Horizon Europe

Usage of a standard sentence for all SSH-flagged topics (scope section), starting with WP 2023-24 (Clusters 1, 3, 4, 5, 6)

"This topic requires the effective contribution of SSH disciplines and the involvement of SSH experts, institutions as well as the inclusion of relevant SSH expertise, in order to produce meaningful and significant effects enhancing the societal impact of the related research activities."

#### How to know a topic is SSH-flagged

#### Ask two key questions:

- Are both SSH terminology and SSH-oriented research questions included in the scope section of the topic?
- Will the consortium require SSH partners to adequately and comprehensively address the issue at stake?

#### **Types of SSH-flagged topics**

"Dedicated" SSH-focused research in Horizon Europe Programme area Cluster 2 (CL2) Work Programmes:

- Finding a solution relies on knowledge and input from SSH researchers and practitioners
- Consortia submitting proposals will mainly consist of partners from various SSH disciplines

#### Topics with SSH components in **other Horizon Europe Clusters' Work Programmes**:

- Multidisciplinary topics where finding a solution requires knowledge and input from both SSH and STEM
- Consortia submitting proposals will need to include <u>both</u> STEM and SSH partners


#### **EU Missions:**

- ▶ The majority of missions have an SSH dimension
- Missions highly focused on generating social transformations/societal impact
- Tied to <u>six EU policy priorities</u>


## Identifying SSH terminology (non-CL2)

Horizon Europe Work Programme 2023-24 (examples!)

intensive	"The proposed research is expected to study the ethical, legal and social aspects as well as health economics of the personalised prevention tools and programmes being developed" (Cluster 1) "Proposals should consider aspects such as gender, regional variations, socioeconomics and culture" (Cluster 1) "Proposals should consider the complex human, social, cultural and ethical aspects that are necessarily managed by those care regimes and healthcare systems" (Cluster 1)	
partial	"with appropriate contributions/expertise from SSH"  "including the relevant SSH dimension"  "produce outcomes enhancing its societal impact"	
marginal	"take into account the SSH aspect of this"  "may benefit from being addressed by SSH"	



SSH contribution in proposal

Often overlooked!

Closely read & understand what the topic is asking for

Can have definite advantages for evaluation of proposal

Find SSH partners

Use existing network; look within own organization


Take part in brokerage events (e.g. from Net4Society) Partner search (Net4Society & Funding &Tenders Opportunities Portal)

Involvement of SSH aspects & partners

Include SSH aspects in <u>all</u> proposal parts (Parts A & B); Part B: Excellence, Impact, Implementation

SSH partners <u>must</u> <u>be</u> part of project consortium Plan sufficient & reasonable budget for SSH partners, tasks, & planned activities

#### **SSH Opportunities Document**

"Opportunities for Researchers from the Socio-economic Sciences and Humanities (SSH) in Horizon Europe"

- Overview of SSH funding chances in Horizon Europe Programme (all Clusters & some other programming areas)
- Goes beyond European Commission flagged topics
- 3 categories: dedicated topics, relevant topics, topics with minor SSH relevance
- Published regularly during project runtime
- Next edition expected: end 2023/beginning 2024


#### **Brokerages**

#### **SSH Integration Monitoring Report**



- A comprehensive **methodology** has been developed to provide measurable indicators of SSH integration
  - Number of SSH partner
  - Budget to SSH partners
  - **Effort**
  - Disciplines
